Why should I upgrade to your Heavy-Duty Bows?

You will need fewer **Heavy-Duty Bows** to handle the tarp's weight, and by spacing them further apart than you would standard galvanized steel bows, you acquire a larger opening for loading. **Heavy-Duty Bows** are preferred by many farmers for silage or for dumping gravel or distiller's grain, as these are heavy and/or wet loads these bows can support with less tarp wear.

For greater bucket clearance, **Heavy-Duty Bows** make use of a rollaway ridgepole. This allows you to space the bows up to a full 12 feet apart, which makes for far less interference during loading. (The ridgepole slips into a pocket sewn and sealed on the outside of the tarp so it rolls up with the tarp, out of the way.)

Heavy-Duty Bows are also available in a flat style that reduce interference with loaders. The no-rise design is perfect for open-top vans that are maxed out on their height allowance.
